As Postmistress of the Harrah Post Office she met and befriended many and was always ready to lend a hand and an ear. Smart, witty and succinct she could be counted on to call it as she saw it. She enjoyed sharing and posting on Facebook, cats figuring prominently along with other articles that expressed her thoughts and feelings.

“ Dear Babich Family;

I've read that there is usually a teacher in everyone's life, who they always remember. Mr. Babich was that teacher for me. I was Ag Shop Assistant in my senior year - working for Mr. Babich in his 1st and 2nd period class. During this time I was also on-my-own, having been kicked out of my house during the summer of 1975, I finished high school, while working at Kelly Oil (local truck stop) for 54 hours per week and maintaining my own apartment, cooking, and laundry. Much of the support I did receive during my senior year was from Mr. Babich. Mr. Babich would allow me to go to the library to get caught up on any lagging school work. In my opinion I would have quit high school if not for the one teacher who supported me - Mr. Babich. He treated me like a person and even though I tried to get by he wouldn't allow me to become a slacker. He held me to a standard that I respected from him and he expected from me - even knowing my situation. He didn't go easy on me and I believe that helped me survive.

I remember one time, my oldest sister, my oldest brother, my next oldest brother and I picking pears in Mr. Babich's orchard.

It wasn't just Mr. Babich though, Marianne supported me as well. My brother and her were boyfriend and girlfriend and she never treated me as that bothersome younger brother of her boyfriend. She always talked to me and treated me as a person. Even when they broke up and into my late twenties she was a friend I spent some time with and occasionally had chats with. She never looked down her nose at me - ever - even when I was down in life.

Marianne was an important part of my early years and I'll never forget her.

Even though it has been years since I've talked with her, I'll miss her.

I'm very sorry for your loss.
