She made the best cookies in the world, and if she had marketed them we'd all be rich by now. She generously hosted countless family dinners, and holiday celebrations.

Everyone who has had the good fortune to know her will attest that her two most precious treasures were her family, and her faith in Jesus. She made sure that every grandchild knew about both of these treasures. The Sunday school song, "Jesus Loves Me," was the theme of her life, and she shared it sweetly with those around her. She was absolutely delighted with her children, grandchildren, great-grandchildren, and dear nieces and nephews. She was a great and constant encouragement to her family. No visit with her ever ended without a treat to eat, a bit of sage advice, and an "I love you."
