Anthony E. "Earl" (Skeeziks) Sanchey Sr. (74) of Wapato passed away on November 28, 2016. Earl was born in Toppenish on April 28, 1942 to George and Matilda (Winnier) Sanchey. An enrolled member of the Yakama Nation and the Catholic Church, Earl was raised and educated in White Swan. He worked for fire management for many years and as a heavy equipment operator in construction. He also worked for Yakima Cement. He loved hunting, camping and fishing in the mountains where he felt at home and will be remembered as a practical joker and prankster, and he had a nickname for everybody in the family and they seemed to stick. He was an avid sports fan who participated in many sports and coached womens fastpitch for many years. He also liked collecting Betty Boop memorabilia.

Mr. Sanchey is survived by his daughter, Krissy Laynaya Sanchey of Billings, MT; three sons, Anthony E. Sanchey Jr of Naches, Jeff Sampson of Ahtanum and Daniel Doore of Toppenish; his grandchildren, Dylan Johnson, Hunter and Haze Old Elk all of Billings, Latonia Andy and Jared Sanchey of Toppenish and White Swan, Ivan Sanchey of Yakima and Izabelle Whitedove of Naches; four brothers, John Sanchey, Roger (Peggy) Sanchey and Carroll (Mary) Sanchey all of White Swan and Willie Sanchey of Yakima; four sisters, Mari (Gary) Varner of Siletz, OR, Sandra Palmer of Wapato, Denise (Mike) Lettig of Sammamish and Bobbi (Jerry) Hert of White Swan; numerous great-grandchildren and nieces and nephews. 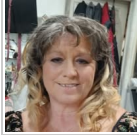
