Toppenish-Archie Lang passed away peacefully into eternal rest on Wednesday, July 23, 2008. He was born on October 16, 1928, in Bismarck, North Dakota, the oldest of seven children born to John and Mary (Fauth) Lang.

He attended elementary school in North Dakota. He then completed 9th grade by a correspondence course. As an adult he studied for and passed a GED test with a high score. He also earned eighteen credits attending YVCC while farming and raising a family.

Archie spent his childhood working on the family farm in North Dakota. He moved to Toppenish, Wa in 1947 along with his family and continued working on the farm.

On February 15, 1959, Archie married Alice Springer in Lodi, California.

Archie, along with his bride, returned to Toppenish and a life of farming.

Archie was a member of the Church of God, 7th Day, in Toppenish. Archie was very active in the church. At various times he served as Elder, Deacon, and on the Church Board.

He is survived by his son Richard Lang of Toppenish, his wife Julie and their sons Bryce and Jace; his daughter Karen Crane, her husband Joe, and Karen's daughter's Alyssa and Brianna Morrow; his daughter Cynthia Avalos of Toppenish, her husband Robert and their children Erika, Joshua, and Eliana.

He is also survived by three brothers and three sisters: Walter Lang of Arizona, wife Moneen; Edwin Lang of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, wife Willigene; Dorothy Becker of Zillah, Wa; Linda Roedel of Seattle, WA; Marvin Lang of Goldendale, WA; Elizabeth Corey, of Howard City, MI, husband George. He was preceded in death by his parents John & Mary Lang, and his wife Alice in 2003.

Archie was active in the community and derived great joy from participating in many community organizations. He was a member of Farm Bureau and served several terms on the Yakima Board. He was elected to serve on the US Government Farm Service County Committee for several terms but stepped down to care for his wife during his last term. He served on the South Yakima Conservation District Committee from 1975 to 2003. He was named Farmer of the Year for Toppenish during the 80's. He served on the Toppenish Rodeo Committee and was actively involved in the Junior Livestock show numerous years.

Our father worked from sunup to sundown as a farmer until Lewy Body Dementia took over his life the last 5 years. I have never known anyone in my life that worked harder than our father. There was never any quitting time or clock to clock out on. His only day of rest was Sabbath, a time for the Lord, his church, and his family. We will miss you Daddy. Thank you for giving so much of your life to others.
