



Carlomagno Agcaoili

July 3, 1918 - March 6, 2017

Carlomagno Agcaoili, 98, long time resident of Parker passed away on March 6, 2017 at Cottage in The Meadow. Carlomagno was born in Vintar, Ilocos Norte, Philippines on July 3, 1918 to Rosalia and Eusebio Agcaoili.

Carlomagno was raised and educated in the Philippines.

Carlomagno served in the United States Army in the Far East during WWII and while serving, he was wounded in action and was taken as a POW. After the military, Carlomagno eventually settled in Parker where he worked as a rancher and farmer raising cattle, horses and vegetables. He also attended the Church of Christ (Iglesia Ni Cristo) and loved during his free time to fish and hunt.

He is survived by his children, Adelaida Malasig of New York, Esperanza Zaniga of Parker, Frederick Agcaoili of Seattle, Perlita Buan of Parker, Norma Felix of Hawaii, and Felinar Agcaoili of Parker; numerous grandchildren; and his sister, Coleta Tolentino of the Philippines. Carlomagno was preceded in death by his wife in 2008.
