She worked as a supervisor at the El Ranchito in Zillah, Wa. for several years. In 1975 she relocated to Red Wood City, California where she worked as a supervisor at a food processing company. She retired in 2002 and returned to Washington State to be near her family.

Our mother was the historian of the family. She was always ready to help as needed. She loved to knit, so her grandchildren & great grandchildren always had nice warm knitted caps for the cold weather. If there was bazaar, she would be there selling her knitted items and kitchen towels. Her past time was going to the casinos and play the slots. She loved family gathering. It gave her time to spend with family and friends.

She was proceeded in death by her mother and father; brothers Jose, Pedro

and Oscar; and sister Alejandra; daughter Delores Ramos & her husband Richard; and grandson Eddie Ramos. She is survived by her daughters Dora (Robert) Daniel of La Conner, WA., Carmen (Art) Davila of Walla Walla, WA, and Helen (Jorge) Lopez of Toppenish; Brother Lino (Adeline) Rojas of Walla Walla, WA., sister Clara (Ray) DeLuna of Granger, WA.
