Remembered as a one who was always quoting a movie or book; he would ask you where the quote was from. A person also had to be careful because if

they ever asked him a question about a specific movie or book he had read you had better be ready to listen because he would talk you ear off. He inspired his co-workers to get into reading his novels.

Carson enjoyed traveling and was currently planning a trip to Brazil and the Phillipines with his step-grandmother, Maya. He was always with his cousin, also considered his big brother, Eric and his brother Marc fishing, hunting and wrestling. Carson enjoyed spending time with them. His co-workers held Carson in high regard and considered him their family. He loved his cat, Castiel and was always posting pictures of him on Facebook.
