Dale L. Walker (75) of Satus passed away in Yakima on Sunday January 2, 2011. He was born in Toppenish on April 14, 1935 to John and Lottie (Lyndes) Walker. Dale was raised and educated in Toppenish and Longview. He logged and worked at Weyerhaeuser while in Longview along with running cattle. On December 2, 1955 he married Judith Hopkins in Longview. He moved his family back to the Satus in the late 60's where he ranched on the Satus and worked for Cascade Natural Gas. He later went to work for the Yakama Nation in Maintenance and worked until retiring in the late 1990's. He was an enrolled member of the Yakama Nation and enjoyed chasing horses, hunting, fishing and still operated his cattle business in his retirement. Dale is survived by his wife, Judy of Satus; four sons, Randy Walker of Toppenish, Tim Walker of Satus, Tom Walker of Lewistown, MT and Dan Walker of Satus; one daughter, Shelly Brown of Bickleton; twelve grandchildren and three great-grandchildren; two brothers, Raymond and Johnny Walker both of Satus; and two sisters, Bev Brown of Yakima and Betty Lacy of Lacey, WA; and numerous nieces and nephews. Dale was preceded in death by his parents, two brothers, Dick and Don and one grandchild, Joshua Brown. Visitation will be held on Wednesday at 9AM at the Toppenish Community Center with a funeral following at 10AM. Interment will follow at the Tulee Cemetery out on the Satus.
