Floyd S. Shock (64) of White Swan died on May 31, 2008 in Bend, OR. He was born in Moxee on October 6, 1943 to Wesley Shock and Velma Frank. He was a member of the Yakama Nation and the Washut religion. He worked as a welder in the Bremerton Shipyards and in various capacities for the Yakama Nation. He was raised by numerous families, mostly by the Nelson & Tillie Moses and Lillian Spino families. He enjoyed traveling, telling stories, watching his great-grandchildren play basketball and was an avid sports fan. He is survived by his wife, Delores Shock of White Swan; five sons, John Shock of Florida, Kerry Shock of Pendleton, Leland Shock of White Swan, Myron Shock of Toppenish and Delvis Jim of White Swan; one daughter, Karen Pinkham of Toppenish; seventeen grandchildren; nine great-grandchildren and the Wyena family.
