March 9, 1913 - October 16, 2009

Frank B. Trevino, 96, a long time resident of Toppenish, passed away in the comfort of his home in the arms of his son, David Trevino, Sr., October 16, 2009 to be with his beloved wife and Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

He was born in Perral, Chihuahua, Mexico on March 9, 1913. He was the third eldest of ten children. He was preceded in death by his wife Maria G. Trevino in 2003. He is survived by two brothers, Ray and Joe Razo of Toppenish, WA. and five children, Frank Trevino Jr. of Tacoma, WA, Thomas Trevino of Redmond , WA, Sylvia Macias of Kenmore, WA , Laura Gonzales of Centralia, WA, and David Trevino Sr. of Toppenish, WA. He has 16 grandchildren, 26 great grandchildren, and 1 great great grandson. His legacy remains as a loving husband, father, grandfather, great grandfather and great great grandfather.

Frank left school at the tender age of 10 to work on the railroads to help support his mother and siblings. He worked for the American Salt Corporation in Kansas. As a teenager, he held the record of 14 railroad carts filled by hand in one day. In 1942 he worked for Aero Parts Manufacturing Company of Wichita, Kansas, building planes. His working life finished with Del Monte of California in Toppenish, WA as a mechanic and foreman in 1975. He always displayed a strong work ethic with fairness, honesty, and compassion. All of these qualities he passed on to his family.

Frank's life was a legacy of devotion to his family, their education and welfare, which will last forever. He enjoyed all types of fishing and hunting. His favorite

was salmon fishing at Westport with his sons and daughters. Later in life he became an enthusiastic Seattle Mariners fan never missing a game on television. His other passion was listening to Bishop Fulton Sheen and Fr. Corapi.
