Howard F. Walker (82) of Toppenish passed away in Toppenish on September 5, 2012. He was born in Prosser on October 13, 1929 to Frank H. and Anna (Gabriel) Walker. Howard graduated from Prosser High School and went to work for Boeing for a short time and later served in the U.S. Army from 1952-54 where he played on the company football team and was an accomplished boxer.

After completing his military obligation he operated a service station in Prosser for two years before moving to Toppenish in 1956 where he started his career in the tire business with a loan from a friend. After just one year and being so successful he was offered the opportunity became an OK Tire dealer in 1957. He purchased the property the business is currently on in 1966 and built the store. In 1989 he became affiliated with Tire Factory and expanded to the front end shop in 1999. They built a car wash in 2009 to better serve the Lower Valley's needs.

Howard was a businessman who developed several patents over the years. He operated Moxee Innovation Company from 1989 to 2010 and was a partner in Cascade Brush Company. Mr. Walker loved Toppenish and being a business person. He held the citizens of Toppenish, the Yakama Nation and the local farmers in very high regard. In 2007 he met Maya and she was by his side throughout his declining health. He enjoyed golfing, the casino, western and bronze artwork, traveling the world and being a businessman. He was a cub and boy scout master and took his kids on weekend campouts

when his children were young. He is survived by his companion and soulmate, Maya McCulley of Toppenish; three sons, Gary Walker of Zillah, Jim Walker of Bellingham and Randy Walker of Toppenish; one daughter, Sharon Finlay of Rockaway Beach, OR; eleven grandchildren, five great-grandchildren; one brother, Earl Walker of Prosser and one sister, Ethel Sizemore of Sacramento, CA. Mr. Walker was preceded in death by his wife, Elsie Walker; one son, J. Robert; his son-in-law, Jeff and seven siblings. Visitation will be on Sunday September 9, 2012 from 1-5PM. Graveside services with military honors conducted will be at the Zillah City Cemetery on Monday September 10, 2012 at 11AM.
