James Scrivner, 76, of Toppenish died Saturday, April 10, 2010 at Yakima Valley Memorial Hospital, as a result of complications following surgery.

Mr. Scrivner was born December 18, 1933 to Pearl & Virgel Scrivner and lived his entire life in the Toppenish/Wapato Area

James graduated from Toppenish High School in 1952. After graduating James worked with his step-father, Jess Bos, who taught him the trade of shoeing horses.

Some of his favorite times growing up were when he and his cousin Fred would saddle up their horses and ride to the Satus Creek area where they enjoyed all the beauty of nature and the outdoors.

James joined the Army in 1955 and served with Company K - 22nd Infantry Regiment. He was honorably discharged in 1962. After his military service James worked for Del Monte for a number of years and U & I Sugar factory until it closed. After retiring he continued to enjoy working with his horses and in recent years surprised his friends with one of his favorite activities of singing Karaoke.
