Jason L. Umtuch (67) of Toppenish died at Toppenish Community Hospital on Wednesday May 7, 2008. He was born in Parker to Reuben and Rosella (Hypier) Umtuch on February 3, 1941. He was raised and educated in the Yakima Valley. He worked for Mt. Adams Furniture Factory, was a diesel mechanic and most recently worked as a maintenance worker for AAOA retiring in 2004.
