Joanne M. Price (80) of Portland passed away at her home in Portland on May 17, 2014. She was born in White Swan to James and Anna (Richards) Olney. She graduated from White Swan High School where she played fastpitch softball and basketball. She went on to serve in the Marine Corps where she was first stationed at Camp Pendleton, CA, Camp Lejune, NC and in Washington D.C. during the Korean War from 1953-58. She met Thomas Price after her military service and they married in Stevenson, WA on August 11, 1959. They had a family and made their home in Portland where she was a homemaker.

Joanne enjoyed surrounding herself with her family, especially during the Memorial Day gathering and camping at Fish Lake stream. She liked to go to the casino's, play pool, where she won many tournaments and trophies, fishing the Columbia River with her sons, and baking her pies and bread, especially her zucchini bread. Joanne was a member of the Yakama Nation and St. Charles Catholic Church in Portland. She took great joy in her children, grandchildren and great grandchildren where she was affectionately called "Grandma Great". Mom will be remembered as a tough Marine, for sense of humor and quick wit, along with her loving nature, will be always cherished by her family and friends.

She is survived by three daughters, Barbara Walker, Susan (Joe) Aleck and

Teresa (Will) Jensen all of Toppenish; four sons, Robert Price of Portland, Thomas (Tracy) Price of Troutdale, Mike (Cammy) of Kennewick and James Price of Portland; 17 grandchildren and eight great grandchildren and numerous nieces and nephews who she loved and cherished as her own.

She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband in 1986; seven sisters, Anna Nagle, Marguerite Whitekiller, Barbara Blodgett, Regina, Virginia, Rosemary and Dorothy Olney; and five brothers, Andrew, Alfred, Gilbert, George and Doug Olney.

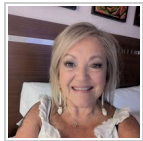

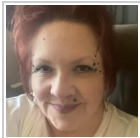

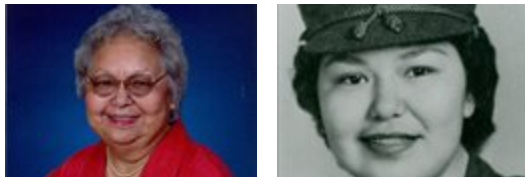
