Louie C. (Spencer) Vargas

Born at home on December 14, 1947 in Toppenish, WA. He went to public school in Toppenish.

August 1967 Louie entered the Armed Services doing his 16 weeks of training at Ft. Lewis, WA. He was then assigned to the 1st Battalion, 87th Infantry (mechanized), 8th Infantry Division, Baumholder, Germany. After seven months he volunteered for duty in the Republic of South Vietnam. He was then assigned to the 2nd Battalion, 8th Cavalry, 1st Air Cavalry Division (Air Mobile). His position was point man for his platoon. He received the bronze star medal for Meritorious Achievement in Ground Operations Against Hostile Forces and The Air Medal for Meritorious Achievement While Participating in Aerial Flight. His tour of duty in Vietnam ended in August 1969. He later was Honorably Discharged August 16, 1973 from Reserve Standby. His rank at discharge was Sergeant E-5.

He worked various jobs before furthering his education at Central Washington University in Ellensburg, WA. He attended Fall of 1973 to Summer of 1977 and graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science. His major focus was governmental law.

Over the years Louie did some motor bike cross country racing, took lessons in race car driving just for the thrill, one spring he rode bulls in Omak, WA, and he chased wild horses with his brother-in-law. He was known as a pool shark by those who watched him play. Bowling became a passion. In his younger

days he played poker out at the White Swan grounds and in Reno, NV. He hunted elk, deer, pheasants, and geese. Louie knew how to enjoy himself without losing sight of working for a living.

In the year 1977, we began our 43-year journey as a family. He also started working for the Yakama Nation Legislative & Legal Dept as a paralegal assistant. He enrolled in the Antioch School of Law through Washington D. C. His biggest project working as a paralegal was developing the Yakama Nation Tax Code. Another assignment was reviewing the Federal Register which brought about the funding for the Commodity Food Program. He also wrote the Hanford Clean Up position paper for the Tribe. Funding for the position ended so he moved on.

He always preferred to be self-employed, so he tried fish buying along the Columbia River from tribal members. It was quite a task: buying, cleaning, and selling. He did it all. He also cut and sold firewood. He worked on the construction of the fish screens at the Union Gap dam area. Then he operated water and log trucks for Wheeler Logging. This is when he became energized to be an owner/operator of his own log truck. About 1993 he purchased a brand new Peterbilt and trailer. He called his business "Lone Star Trucking, Inc.". He operated for 15 years before retiring.

Louie left this life and went on to his next journey December 15, 2020. He will forever be in our memories as a protector, a teacher in life skills, a brother, a grandpa, a papa, a stepdad, an uncle, a friend, a veteran, and my husband. He spoiled us with his love and caring and was always there for us. Rest in peace now Louie. Your life was well lived, and you are deeply loved.

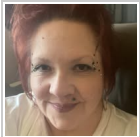
