Madeline Omlin passed away October 7th at home, surrounded by her family. Madeline was born in 1923 in Spokane, Washington to August and Rosa (Lauzier) Aubert. She grew up on a sheep ranch in Connell. Summers were spent in the Coeur d'Alene area where the sheep summer ranged. Coeur d'Alene held a special place in her heart with many fond memories. The family later moved to Walla Walla. After graduating from St. Vincent School in 1941, she worked at St. Mary's hospital.

In 1949 she married Joseph Omlin and moved to the family farm in Toppenish, which was her home for 63 years. Madeline was a true farm woman, working side by side with her husband. She was a devoted wife, loving mother, grandmother and great-grandmother. She loved to bake and always had dessert and a cup of coffee for family or visitors. She was a giving, caring person who thought of others before herself. She always had an optimistic outlook and a wonderful sense of humor, with a smile and a laugh for everyone. Madeline loved to take trips with her family, especially to the Oregon coast. Family was important to her.

She was a long time parishioner of St. Aloysius Catholic Church.

She was preceded in death by her husband of 49 years, Joseph in 1998 and her sister Simone Miller in 2007.
