Then her first battle with Breast Cancer kept her from working so she decided to be a grandmother and help raise kids. Among them are Devante Lewis, Lucas Wahpat, Caleb Wahpat, and Maddison Wahpat. Also supported student athletes in sports by going to games whenever they played. There is another person she shared birthdays with and they called each other sister- Colleen Miller.

When our dad's health started to decline she became caregiver for him till he left us. Later she adopted a dog and named him Hennie Sour Patch Squeoch and they were always together.
