Later on she worked for the Yakama Nation as a cook at the Tribal Headstart, and Homemaker at the then called "Receiving Home" now known as Nuk-Nu-We-Sha. She was owner and operator of Pauline's Creations, putting together beautifully designed beaded earrings, necklaces, medallions and much more. She traveled the country with her husband to Native Conferences and Pow-Wows selling her creations, sharing time with friends on the Pow-Wow trail, and making new ones over the course of 40+ years. She drew happiness from spending time with family, relatives and friends that were like family. She was always generous with her time and resources. She enjoyed helping people always, and cared a lot. She left behind a legacy of being a wonderful Yakama elder, that always had a smile for you. Her soft voice and adorable smile will be dearly missed on the Yakama Reservation and many others.
