Pete “Petie” Duane Wagenman Jr. lost his 6 month battle with cancer Tuesday June 26, 2018, at 2:40 pm. He was born in Toppenish, Washington, on July 20, 1951 to Pete and Carol Wagenman.

Pete started working for Kissler Farms at 14 years old, then worked for Simmons Rock Crushing, and then Martin Marietta Aluminum in Goldendale. For the last 25 years he worked as a truck driver, most recently for Kodiak Trucking and Yakama Forest Products.

Pete was a true craftsman, jack of all trades. He took a repossessed broken down double wide and turned it into a beautiful home.

Pete was married young and had his first baby girl, Tammy. Later he had his second baby girl, Shelley. Then, he met our mother, Judy (Dale). When he married Mom, he found himself the Dad of three more little girls: Shannon, Katie, and Suzanne. He was our Dad in every sense of the word. He played with us, took us on trips, taught how us to work hard, and took care of us when we were sick.

As a husband, he seemed to always make our Mom’s life easier and happier. He would get us up early for school and make us breakfast so mom could

sleep in. After a long day in her ministry he would go out and carry her heavy bags and purse into the house, and would often make dinner for us. Young husbands could learn a lot about how to treat their wives from our Dad.

He touched the lives of so many with his sense of humor and laughter. In fact we were recently told by someone Dad worked with that he brightened her day every time she saw him.

He was also a “true fan” of Elvis Presley. He shared this love of Elvis with his children and grandchildren.

Preceded in death by his parents, his brother-in-law Dean Patnode and two nephews, Greg and Marvin.
