March 31, 1961 - May 14, 2010

Santos Castilleja (49) of Harrah passed away on Friday May 14, 2010 in Harrah. He was born in Prosser on March 31, 1961 to Victor and Josephina (Muniz) Castilleja Sr. He was raised in the Yakima Valley and graduated from White Swan in 1980. He attended CWU and worked for Labbeemint, Goldendale Aluminum. Santos continued his education at Perry Tech where he obtained an HVAC certificate. He was working for AMB Tools at the time of his death. Santos enjoyed softball (Harrah Boys) and was known as sugar bear. he played basketball for the Rim riders. He was active in the Wapato Football Booster and White Swan Parent Football and was known for his hot dogs and hamburgers. He loved family get-togethers, family volleyball tournaments, making tamales as a family for Christmas, and working on his mustang with his boys. He always talked about how amazing it was watching his boys being born. He loved watching sports on TV, supporting his son's football and basketball teams. He was an active Community member, Harrah Town council member and grandparent of three. He enjoyed his Sunday coffee with Steve and Kiana. Santo's always had a smile on his face and was kind hearted and would never say no to anyone. He enjoyed pinching and squeezing his niece and nephews cheeks. Santos loved working in his garden which he called "Dads Sanctuary" and he had a green thumb for growing plants. He considered Kiana and Sierra the girls he and Melissa never had. He donated a kidney to his sister, Shorty in 1989. Santo's had nicknames for all his nieces and nephews, mostly adding "gut" to the ends of their names

except for Angelina which he always called Gina-Gina.

He is survived by his wife of 28 years, Melissa of Harrah; his father, Victor Castilleja Sr. of Wapato; four sons, Danny (Vanessa) Rothrock Castilleja of Florida, Andrew Castilleja of Wapato and Aaron and Ki Castilleja both of Harrah; three grandchildren; three brothers, Victor (Sheree) of Yakima, Steve (Rachel) and Ray (Jolena) both of Harrah; six sisters, Sylvia Arambul of Wapato; Rosie (Hector) Diaz of Texas, Estella (Art) Gonzalez of Sunnyside, Alicia (Felix Jr.) Cordova of Harrah, Mary (Isaac) Bobb of Brownstown and Christy (Jeff) Chumley of Toppenish and numerous nieces and nephews. Santos was preceded in death by his mother, his father-in-law, Charles R. Gwinn; his stepmother, Virginia Castilleja, his brother-in-law, Jim Aleck Sr. and his grandmother, Andrea Coronado.

Visitation will be on Thursday at Colonial Funeral Home from 11-6. Funeral services will be held at the Harrah Grace Brethren Church in Harrah on Friday at 10AM with interment to follow at Reservation Community Memorial Park west of Wapato. We are here to celebrate the life of a kind, selfless, wonderful soft spoken person.

Santos was born into what quickly became a very large family. As it goes in families with many children, some children grow up to be outspoken while others grow up to be quiet and soft spoken. He was always very quiet, but his silence spoke strongly and deeply.

Santos worked hard at school and loved playing sports. After graduating from High School, he attended college at Central Washington University in Ellensburg. His giving heart showed. He donated a kidney to his sister Alice in 1989. He unselfishly gave up his time to serve on the Harrah City Council for the last several years as well as numerous hours helping with various sports organizations.

In 2003, Santos graduated from JM Perry Institute earning an HVAC certification. He then began his career with Divco working on commercial air conditioners. This required him to climb to the top of tall commercial buildings. He quickly found other employment because you see, Santos was afraid of heights. In 2004 he found employment with AMB tools and Equipment in Yakima servicing and repairing commercial pressure washers.

I worked for the City of Yakima, and had the pleasure to see Santos from time to time when he would come and repair the machines that City employees would somehow manage to break.

I grew up with Santos my whole life. We attended Harrah grade school from kindergarten through 5th grade. Summers were filled with riding our bikes, swimming in the irrigation ditches around Harrah and playing pee wee baseball. We were then bused from Harrah to White Swan Middle School and then White Swan High School until...of course he bought THE Mustang...cool dude!!!

When I drove up to the house yesterday to visit with his family, there it was sitting in the yard. A work in progress, and a different color than the last time I saw it. No hood scoop, but a sunroof I had not seen before. It has been one of Santos' legacies. When we were in high school, it became our "wheels" to school, at least on the days it was running, or when he was able to put it all back together before the weekend was over. Checking on the Mustang's progress yesterday, I noticed a White Swan High School parking permit. Funny, I don't remember that in our High School days. Ah, then I noticed TWO parking permit stickers. Hmm what was up with this? I found the answer, yes, Andrew and then later Aaron were able to drive THE Mustang to High School.

Speaking of High School, there were 5 of us that hung out together. All day, everyday...pretty much inseparable.

In our junior year, we came up with the idea to attend the Masquerade Dance going dressed as gangsters. It was then the fun began....without our parent's generosity, we had to be frugal, so we shopped at goodwill and second hand stores for all of the necessary garb gangsters wore. We ended up with pin strip suits that probably sold for hundreds of dollars when they were new, shirts, ties...the works. I think the whole outfit per person was about 6 bucks, and 2.50 of that were for hats. We couldn't find 5 hats that were the same, so we bought brand new straw hats that farmers wore back then...it was all we could find that represented the gangster look. We sure didn't care cuz man...we looked liked 1920's gangsters. We were Cooool ...!!!

Attending a smaller school gave every kid ample chances to play sports. And who was always first in line? Santos of course. He enjoyed sports so much that when he became a father, he couldn't stand by and watch his boys play but had to assist the coaches doing whatever they needed him to do.
